We've provided the Dirty Dozen; twelve spicy and intriguing questions to spark discussion and help you uncover the spine-tingling depths of the story.

## The Dirty Dozen

### Foreplay - Warm Up Questions

1. What's the overall spice level? 1 (Not Spicy) - 10 (Spiciest Thing I've Ever Read)?
2. How does the spice level compare to the other books we've read together?
3. Jack makes friends with strangers in under five minutes. Are you the kind of person who works the room... or hugs the wall and waits for someone to find you? How has that shaped your relationships—romantic or otherwise?

### The Spicy Bits - Gettin' Down and Dirty with the Plot

4. Eden calls herself out for trying to scam the “nicest billionaire in California.” If you've read *Highest Bidder*, how does her guilt here hit different? Do you believe in redemption through kink, or is that just the fantasy talking?
5. Eden sees herself as a bumbling people-pleaser, nowhere near the confident sexual force she envies. Can you relate? Do you think sexual confidence is built, or born?
6. Madame says we have to unlearn everything we've been taught about sexuality and shame. What did you have to unlearn to enjoy sex on your own terms? Or are you still in that process?
7. “We have to keep that spark going...” Long-term lovers, how do you do it? What have you tried (or fantasized about trying) to keep the sexual tension sizzling?
8. Madame/Mama—two personas, one woman. If you lost the roles that define you (mother, partner, boss, etc.), who would you be underneath it all? Can your identity survive without your titles?

9. Jade questions whether she could let a partner seek out their desires with someone else if she couldn't fulfill them. Could you ever be open to that arrangement? Why or why not?

10. "If I'm not Madame Kink, then what's the allure?" Do you ever feel like your appeal is tied to performance—sexual or emotional? Would someone still want you if you dropped the act?

11. "*Love is a mistake. Only sex and power are real.*" Is this Eden's pain talking, or a deeper truth? Have you ever believed this—truly—or just pretended to protect yourself?

## Aftercare - Final Thoughts

12. If Madame's rules were a real-life playbook for pleasure and self-discovery, would you be brave enough to follow them all—even the messy ones? Which rule resonated the most... or scared you a little?
