The Dirty Dozen

Foreplay - Warm Up Questions

1. What's the overall spice level? 1 (Not Spicy) - 10 (Spiciest Thing I've Ever Read)?
2. How does the spice level compare to the other books we've read together?
3. What do you think pulls people into gang life—loyalty, danger, power, or the promise of found family? Would you be tempted if it meant protection... or revenge?

The Spicy Bits - Gettin' Down and Dirty with the Plot

4. She drugged her own bodyguard just to sneak out at 17. Should he be held responsible for what followed, or did she know exactly what she was doing?
5. If you were going to a club like the one in *Ruthless Savage*, would you want the anonymity of a mask... or would you want to be seen? Why?
6. Have you ever been fed by someone else—slow, intimate, deliberate? If not, would you want to try it? What about that act feels erotic... or uncomfortably vulnerable?
7. If you were in Eriu's position, would you enter the auction? Would you risk everything for a chance at power, protection, or pleasure on your own terms?
8. Konstantin gets involved in this twisted dynamic—but is he soft underneath the savage, or playing the long game? Can a man this dangerous be genuinely kind without an agenda?

9. In a setting soaked in violence and corruption, what does “pure love” even look like? Do you believe in it, or is love always a little messy, a little dirty, and a lot complicated?
10. Would you want to visit a place like the club, knowing what might be waiting inside? What would you wear—or not wear?
11. Did you suspect the professor or Karen first? What tipped you off—or completely fooled you? Do you think betrayal stings more when it comes from someone who acts harmless?

Aftercare - Final Thoughts

12. Could you forgive Karen for what happened, or is betrayal the kind of thing you only survive by cutting the person out completely (even just her memory in this case)? Where’s your personal line?

Bonus: What questions do you have for the author? If you could dog-ear a page with a question for the author, what would it be?
