The Dirty Dozen

Foreplay - Warm Up Questions

1. What's the overall spice level? 1 (Not Spicy) - 10 (Spiciest Thing I've Ever Read)?
2. How does the spice level compare to the other books we've read together?
3. If you could summon supernatural help - a demon, deity, or spirit - would you do it? What would you want from them, and what price would you be willing - or unwilling - to pay?

The Spicy Bits - Gettin' Down and Dirty with the Plot

4. The story blends horror and lust in fascinating ways. Does fear heighten the erotic tension for you, or does it make it harder to stay in the moment?
5. Rae's line that "a woman should never be ashamed of wanting sexual pleasure for herself" hits hard in a genre where shame and desire often intertwine. How does this book handle female pleasure compared to others in dark romance?
6. Too many of the mortals in this world live "constrained lives," limited by morality. Do you think moral boundaries protect us from corruption, or do they keep us from fully living?
7. The idea of "ownership" and "forever" comes up a lot. Do you read those as romantic promises, power dynamics, or something darker?
8. The descriptions of Hell are lush, strange, and beautiful. Did you picture it as a place of torment, temptation, or something entirely different?

9. Rae admits that some of her darkest fantasies only feel safe inside her head or in a consensual role play. How does the book handle the tension between fantasy and consent, especially in scenes where she's helpless but still in control of the choice? Did it feel empowering, uncomfortable, or both?

10. Pain and pleasure overlap in this book - from the piercing scene to moments of surrender. Where do you draw the line between erotic and extreme?

11. The final act moves fast - from Rae's capture to the Hadleighs' downfall and the "ending" of the God. Did that quick resolution feel satisfying, or did it leave you wanting more time to explore the aftermath? How did the pacing affect your emotional investment in Rae's survival, her giving up her soul, and the story's conclusion?

12. When you close the book, what lingers more: the heat, the horror, or the heart? What did *Her Soul to Take* make you feel or think about that surprised you the most?
