We've provided the Dirty Dozen; twelve spicy and intriguing questions to spark discussion and help you uncover the spine-tingling depths of the story.

## The Dirty Dozen

### Foreplay - Warm Up Questions

1. What's the overall spice level? 1 (Not Spicy) - 10 (Spiciest Thing I've Ever Read)?
2. How does the spice level compare to the other books we've read together?
3. Feyre throws herself into Solstice prep - volunteering and helping rebuild lives - but she still feels like it's not enough. Have you ever felt that way when trying to help others? What kind of "personal" impact do you think she's searching for?

### The Spicy Bits - Gettin' Down and Dirty with the Plot

4. Feyre is only 21, yet she's been through wars, trauma, and mating bonds. How does her age sit with you in the context of her relationship with Rhysand and the weight she carries? Does she feel young or ancient?
5. Rhysand jokingly claims a "heap of pine" is Night Court tradition, then invites Feyre to help decorate. How do small, domestic moments like this shift your perception of their bond? Can softness be just as intimate as spice?
6. The inner circle teases, bickers, and celebrates together like a real family. Which Solstice moment made you laugh the most and which made you feel unexpectedly emotional?
7. Amren chooses a puzzle over politics during Solstice. What does this quieter choice say about her transformation since the war? How do you think each member of the Inner Circle is coping in their own way?
8. Cassian, Azriel, and Rhys - three Illyrian legends - spend part of Solstice hurling snow at each other like overgrown children. What does this say about their bond?

Is it silly, healing, or both?

9. During the cabin getaway Feyre gets a little mischievous, sending Rhys dirty thoughts while he's stuck in the birchin with the rest of the family. How did you feel about that playful moment?

10. Elain is present but seems distant, fixating on things like unnecessary shopping or staring at insignias. What do you make of her role in this book? Does she feel lost, or is she just quietly rebuilding herself?

11. Nesta shows up to Solstice only to collect her rent, barely speaks to anyone, drinks heavily, and ultimately lashes out at Cassian. What do you think was really driving her behavior - grief, guilt, pride, something else? Did you feel more sympathy or frustration in that moment, and why?

## Aftercare - Final Thoughts

12. Frost and Starlight is all about slowing down and reconnecting. Did this novella give you closure after Wings and Ruin? What emotional threads did it tie off or leave hanging?

Bonus: What questions do you have for the author? If you could dog-ear a page with a question for the author, what would it be?
