## The Dirty Dozen

### Foreplay - Warm Up Questions

1. What's the overall spice level? 1 (Not Spicy) - 10 (Spiciest Thing I've Ever Read)?
2. How does the spice level compare to the other books we've read together?
3. Discuss the glory hole kink - both male and female. Does sexual anonymity sound freeing to you, or does the idea of being reduced to pure physical connection feel unsettling? (P.S. How great was it that the author provided a visual with the QR code!?)

### The Spicy Bits - Gettin' Down and Dirty with the Plot

4. Even though the Key Club experience was anonymous, would you feel the same rejection that Penny did or would it just be "part of the game" for you?
5. *"Why can I only let my guard down when I've been plied with drinks or when I'm f\*cking a stranger?"* Discuss Lincoln's epiphany and whether or not it resonates with you in any areas of your own life.
6. If you found out your anonymous hook-up was your cousin, even adopted cousin, would you feel like Penny or Lincoln?
7. Do you ever feel like people only tolerate you when you're easy-going and pleasant, and how does that shape the way you show up in relationships?
8. In power-play or kink dynamics, what actually makes you feel safest? Is it the rules like safe words, the trust, or the specific person holding the control - like when Lincoln stopped when she said stop instead of using the safe word?

9. When do you think it's time to talk about kinks and sexual compatibility: before the first date, after chemistry is established on the date, or only once feelings are real?
10. Penny says that Lincoln's words alone made her come on the spot. Is that only in books or do you think it's possible in real life?
11. If the family of someone you were secretly hooking up with welcomed you and pushed for the relationship to go public, would that make you feel supported or boxed in before you were ready?

12. Do you think eloping was the right call? Did/would you elope - or at least seriously consider it?
